We issue licences to allow the recording, public performance and broadcast of our members' musical works for most purposes (in accordance with the 1988 Copyright, Designs and Patents Act) and collect and distribute the royalties due to our members.

The MCPS-PRS Alliance manages common activities, services both societies and is jointly owned by them.

## MCPS

The MCPS collects and distributes 'mechanical' royalties generated from the recording of music onto many different formats. This income is distributed to its members – the writers and publishers of music.

### What's covered..

An MCPS Licence is required for the exploitation of the following three rights:  
(a) The right to record MCPS members' musical works into programmes and presentation material (e.g. jingles trailers, station idents, programmes **BUT NOT** commercials, promos or sponsorship messages or any programmes not produced by the station).

(b) The right to transfer MCPS members' repertoire onto computer hard disk or any other medium or format for storage purposes prior to broadcast

(c) The right to broadcast MCPS library members' production music recordings (whether from commercials, programming items or any other source)

PLEASE NOTE THAT NO LICENCE, WHETHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, SHALL BE TAKEN TO HAVE BEEN GRANTED BY MCPS, PRS OR THEIR MEMBERS MERELY BY THE COMPLETION OF THIS APPLICATION FORM.

BOTH MCPS AND PRS WILL ISSUE SEPARATE RECEIPTED INVOICES ONCE THE APPLICATION IS APPROVED AND PROCESSED, THIS WILL SERVE AS PROOF OF ITS LICENCE IN ADDITION TO LICENCES FROM MCPS & PRS YOU MAY ALSO REQUIRE A LICENCE FROM RECORD COMPANIES FOR THE USE OF THE SOUND RECORDING.
